New Domain Teams were formed and began meeting on a bi-weekly basis. The Carroll County General Health District continued to coordinate the implementation of the Carroll County Community Health Improvement Plan by facilitating meetings and activities to increase education and services for Addiction & Mental Health, Maternal & Child Health (Reducing Risky Behaviors), and Access to Care.

There were **175** influenza vaccines provided at the Drive Thru Flu Shot Clinic!

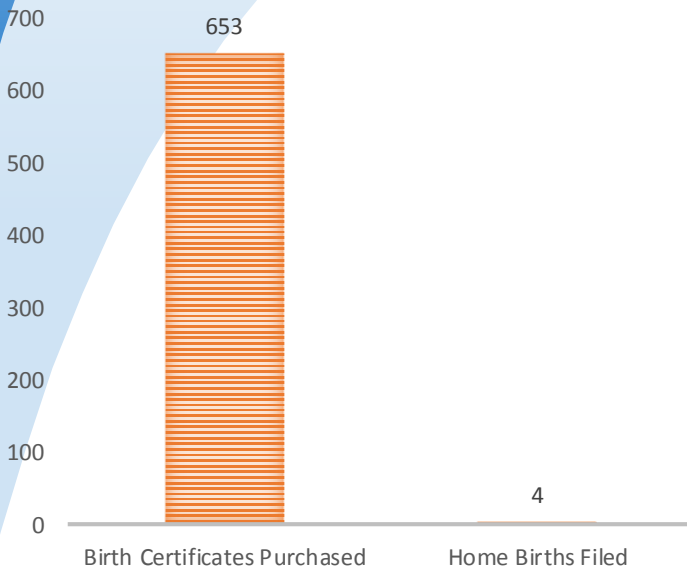


There were **205** pertussis vaccines provided at the clinic!

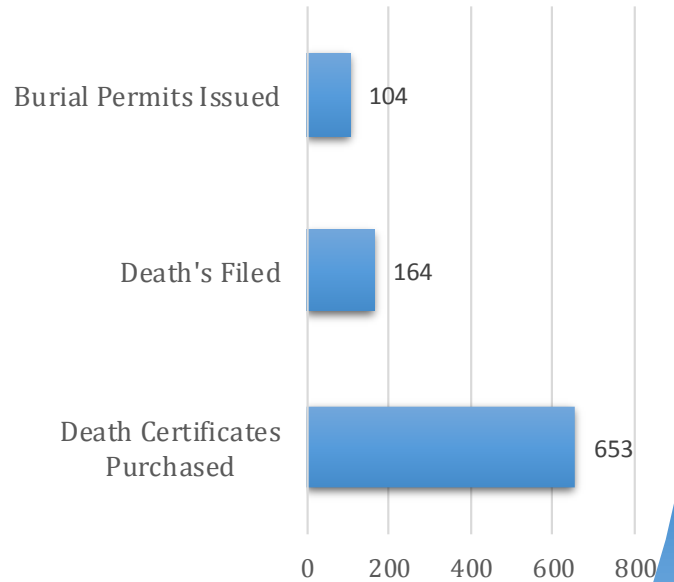

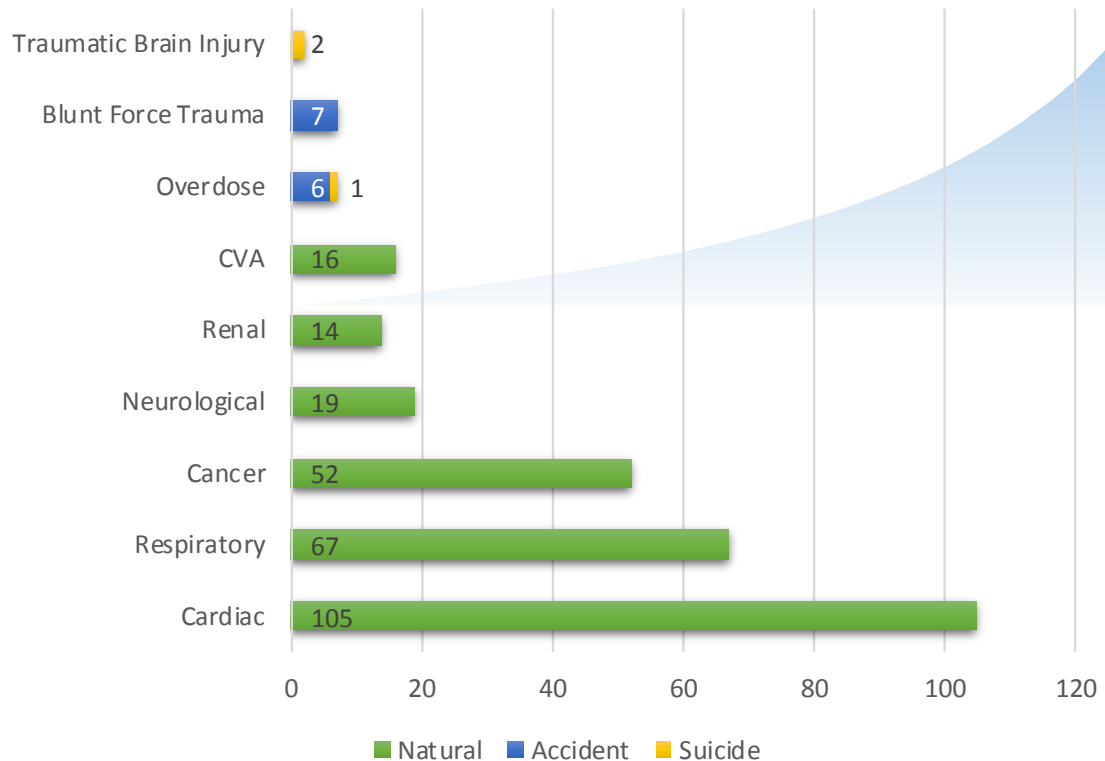
## BIRTH CERTIFICATES, CARROLL COUNTY, 2018

# Nursing and Population Health

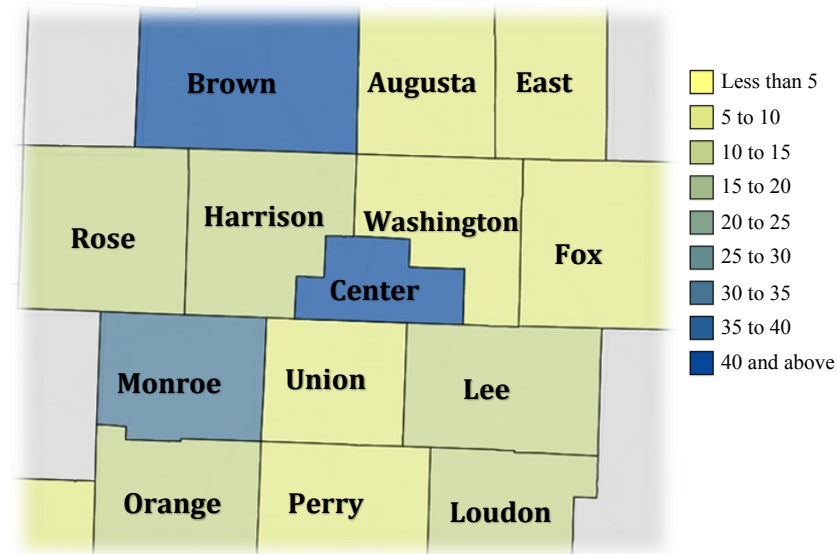
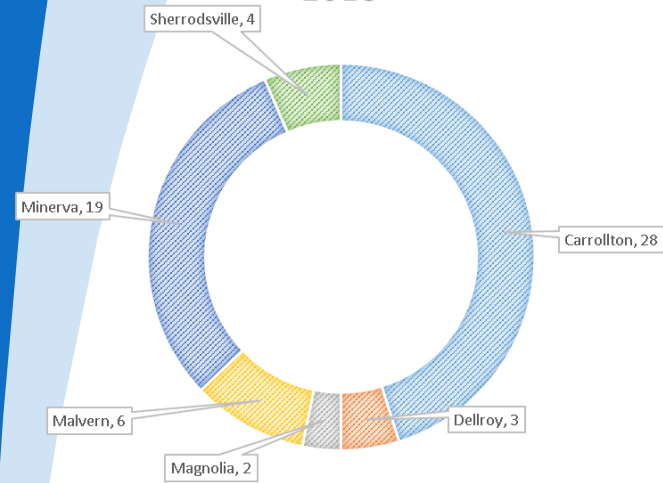
There were three fatalities related to traffic crashes in 2018.

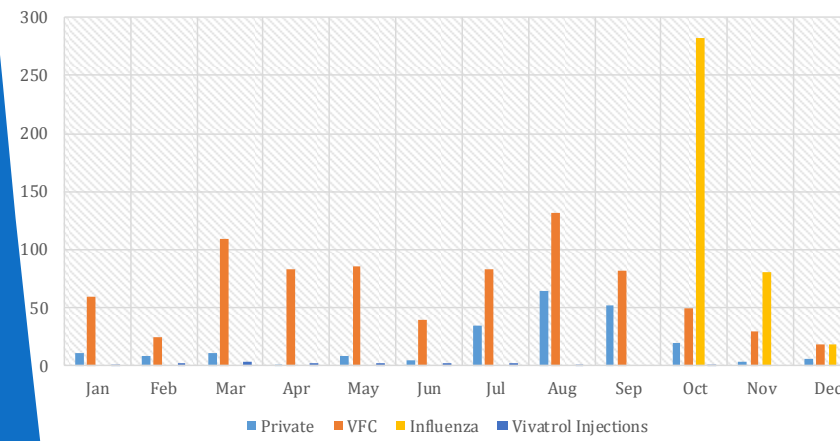

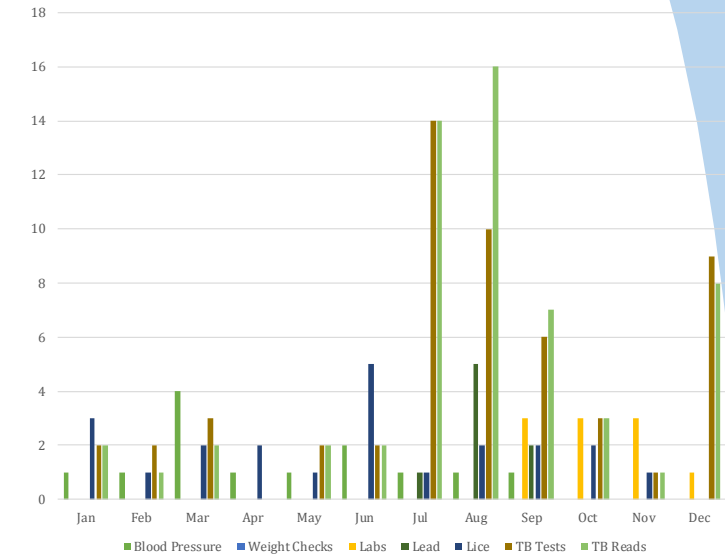
Immunizations, 2018



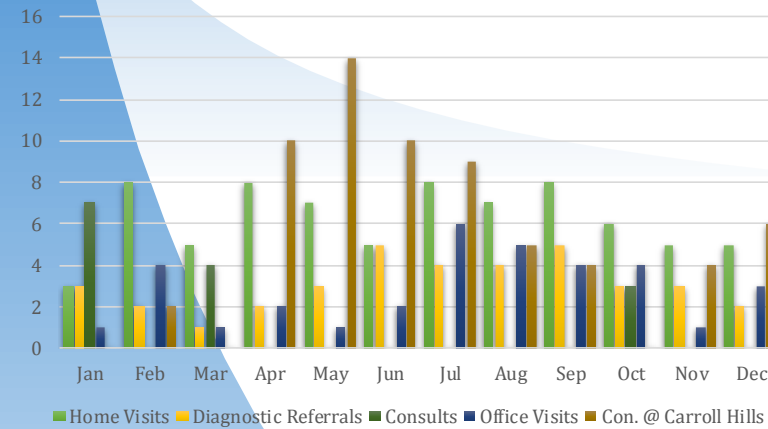
There were 818 immunizations appointments in 2018. This was an average of 68.2 appointments per month!

Nursing Services, 2018



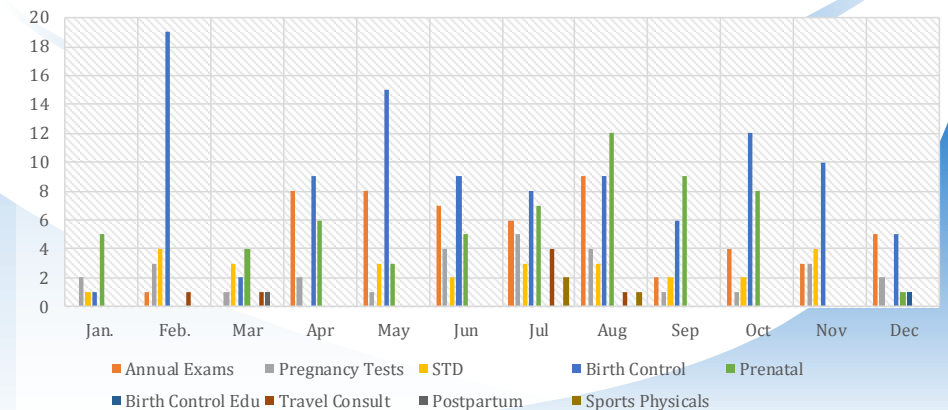
Bureau of Children with Medical Handicaps Services, 2018

## Type of Inspection, by Township, 2018

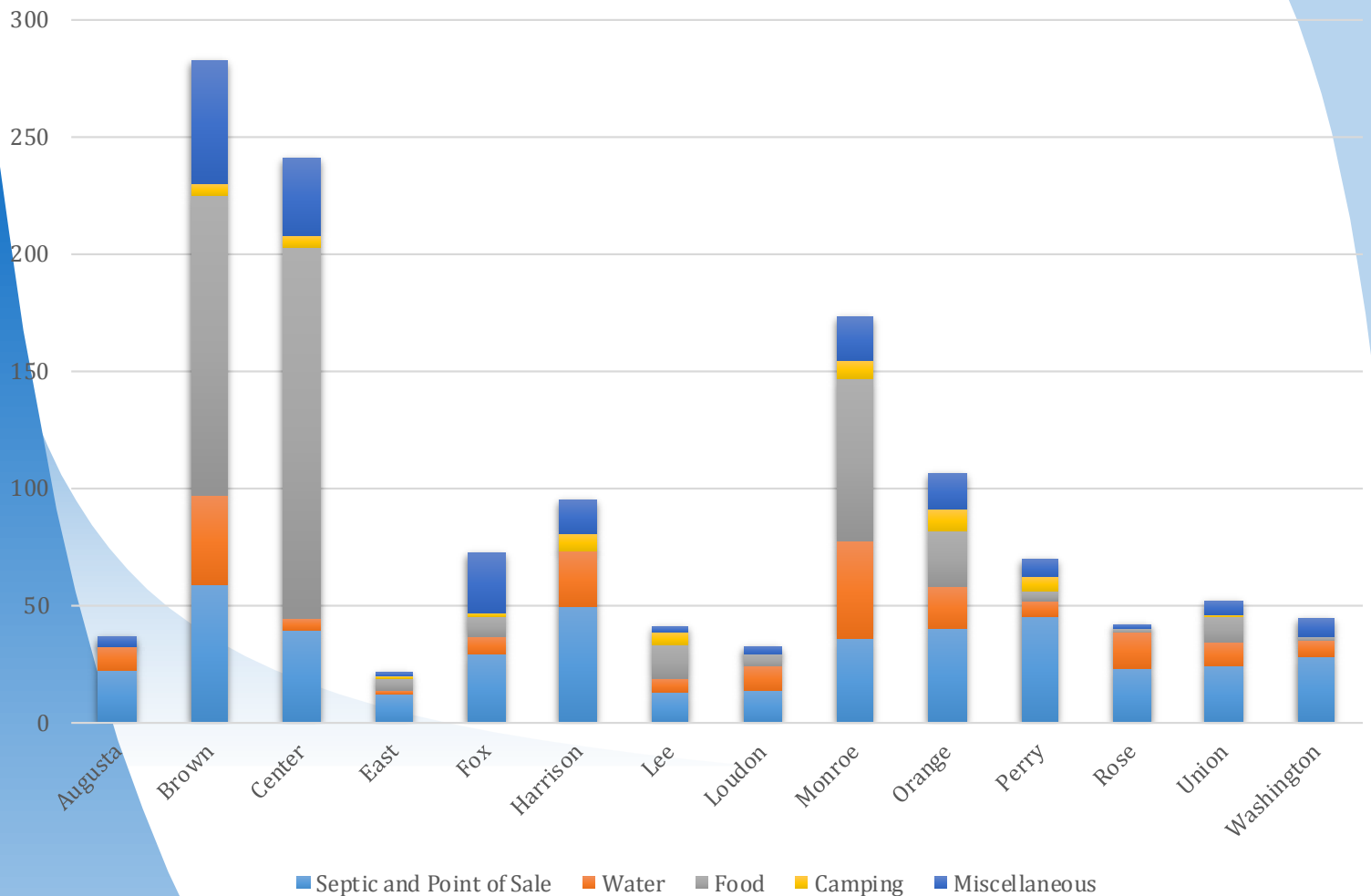


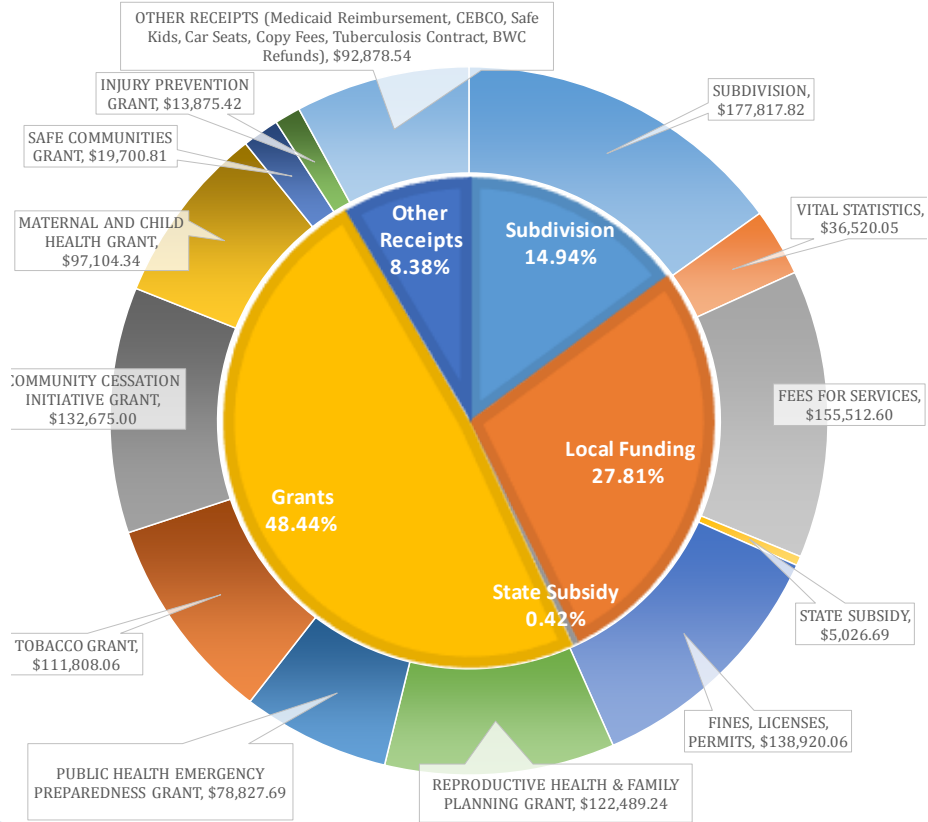

## Rabies

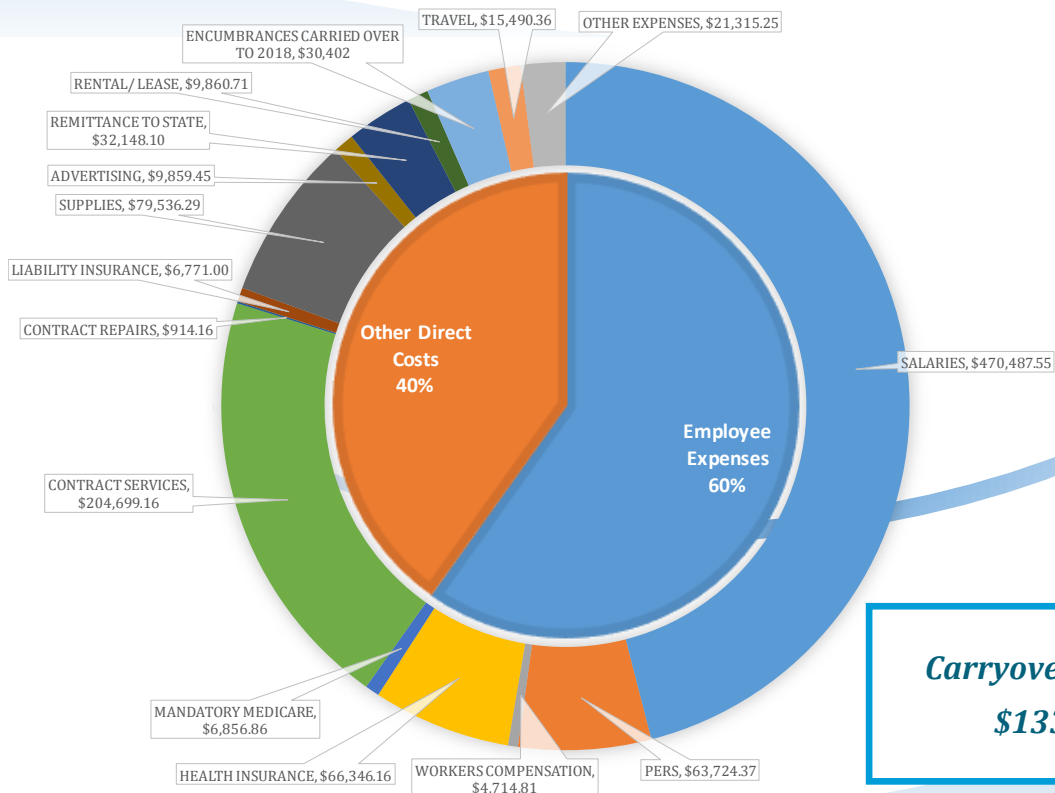
In August 2018, CCGHD was notified by the Ohio Department of Health that a raccoon that had been sent to them was positive for rabies. This was the first positive case that CCGHD has had. This initiated a public health response, involving a multitude of partners. Partners that were involved in the rabies investigation included: Carroll County Emergency Management Agency, Sherrodsville Mayor Moffet, Ohio Department of Health, United States Department of Agriculture— Wildlife Services, and Carrollton Animal Hospital. We appreciate everyone's involvement in the mitigation of rabies. Carroll County ended 2018 with the first three confirmed raccoon rabies.
